RULE CHANGES

- 12 players per team
- Yellow and Red card system in place in games with paid umpires
- If batter caught and they cross, new batter must be on strike for next ball
- No ball off pitch cannot be hit by batter, no ball on pitch moving off pitch can be hit by batter but bat must be over pitch at impact

TRAINING STANDARDS

- Attend all prescribed training sessions unless an exemption is granted by senior coach or chairman of selectors
- Arrive just prior to 6pm to be ready to start on time
- On arrival place name on whiteboard for a bat and bowl in the nets (nets start at 6:20 after warm up)
- Train in Nuna hat, purple training tops and dark shorts or track pants
- Move as directed by coaches, net captains or fielding coaches through fielding drills or nets
- Work on batting **and** bowling at training, regardless of dominant skill area
- Active participation in all prescribed activities (not just going through the motions)
- Drills in small groups to maximise participation

PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU:

- Attend training as often as you can and let Damien know of any issues
- Arrive in time to help set up for home games or to warm up for away games
- Wear Nuna purple/gold and back to and from games and warm ups
- Help clean up after home games
- Help tidy the social rooms (*don't simply leave empty glass or plate behind*)
